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KLA Content Summaries

English

In Stage 3 students work on the required skills to communicate effectively, using considered language to entertain, inform and persuade audiences for an increasing range of purposes. They work productively and independently in pairs or groups to deliver effective presentations using various skills and strategies.

In Term 1 we will create well-structured and well-presented, informative texts for a wide range of purposes and audiences. Classes will begin by researching and writing informative reports about their class name and then move on to writing links with other key learning areas.

Students will continue to develop skills and strategies involved in independently reading and viewing a range of complex texts and visual images. They will respond to themes and issues within texts, recognising different points of view and justify interpretations by referring to their own knowledge, values and experiences.

In supporting Stage 3 students at home, Leura Public School encourages students to read on a regular basis outside of school. Parents can help by making reading a priority and part of the family routine every day. This could involve reading quietly to themselves, reading out loud to a parent/sibling or listening to an adult or other competent reader reading to them.



Mathematics

Stage 3 learning will focus on the following areas: Whole Numbers — ordering, reading and representing numbers of any size and describing properties of whole numbers

- Addition & Subtraction selecting and applying appropriate strategies for addition and subtraction with numbers of any size
- Patterns & Algebra analyzing and creating geometric and number patterns, and completing number sentences
- Length selecting and using the appropriate unit and device to measure lengths and distances
- Time using am/pm notation and 24 hour time in real-life situations
- 2D Space manipulating, classifying and drawing two dimensional shapes, including equilateral, isosceles and scalene triangles, and describing their properties
- Position locating and describing position on maps using a grid reference system
- Data using appropriate methods to collect data and constructing, interpreting and evaluating data displays

Science and Technology

Students will learn about Digital Systems and Networks. They will investigate the different components of digital systems that are used to perform different functions. They will work collaboratively in the exploration of how the main components in digital systems connect and transmit data.

Through investigating how existing information systems meet the needs of our communities today, students will look at how things might change within their future. They will explore current ethical, social and technical protocols used when communicating through information systems.

Geography

Students will investigate how people change the natural environment in Australia, with a particular case study on Circular Quay. They will examine how people influence the characteristics of places, including the management of spaces. Students will learn through the historical inquiry process, working to answer key questions using investigation, discussion and comparison.

Creative Arts

Year 3-6 Creative Arts groups will take place on Wednesday afternoons.

In visual arts students will create an artwork related to their class name. They will then observe and draw musical instruments in detail, study artists such as Picasso and Chagall where the subject matter is about music and create a mixed media collage using some of these artist's techniques.



PDHPE

In PDH, students will start the term with learning focused on 'Personal Identity'.

This learning includes:

- influences on self-esteem and behaviour (such as family, friends, community, personal abilities, body changes, increased responsibility)
- developing and maintaining a positive self-concept
- setting goals
- influences of media and culture
- feelings about self and others
- gender images and expectations

Later this term, students will be involved in leading our revised Peer Support program, which will link with 'Safe Living' and our school's preventative anti-bullying strategies.

In PE, learning will be focused on the movement and game skills of basketball. Our sport session will be every Thursday this term, so students will need to wear their sport uniform on this day each week. Students will also participate in regular fitness sessions each week, with a focus on skipping. We have teamed up with the Jump Rope for Heart organisation for this program.
