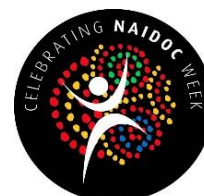

Our school staff is engaged in some professional learning around the text 'Clarity' by Lyn Sharratt. We are embarking on a whole school journey towards school improvement. As a collective we want to support, enable and extend our students so that they can flourish and succeed at school. We want our students to be at their best and reach their full potential. Within the text Clarity, there are little sections that our parents and caregivers would find useful.

5 Questions Parents Can Ask Teachers

1. What is my child learning?
2. How is my child going?
3. How do you know (how my child is doing)?
4. How can my child improve?
5. What supports can I provide and can you provide if my child is struggling? When will we check in again?

These questions are designed to support parents to engage in their child's learning.

5 Questions that Parents Can Ask Their Children

1. What did you learn today?
2. How do you know?
3. What did you do if you did not understand?
4. How can you improve on your learning?
5. What are you most proud of?

These questions are to support parents in having informative conversations with their children.

Engagement

Thank you to the volunteers who supported us at the Stage 1 Zoo excursion. This was a successful day and our students and staff had a fabulous time. Well done Mrs. Hutchinson who organised this event.

Thank you to our kindergarten teachers for their organisation of the Walking Tour of Leura. This was an engaging activity which extended on the mapping lessons being covered in class.

Attendance

Regular attendance at school for every student is essential if students are to achieve their potential, and increase their career and life options. Schools in partnerships with parents are responsible for promoting the regular attendance of students. While parents are legally responsible for the regular attendance of their children, school staff, as part of their duty of care, record and monitor part and whole day absences. Schools, in providing a caring teaching and learning environment, which addresses the learning and support needs of students, including those with additional learning and support needs or complex health conditions, foster students' sense of wellbeing and belonging to the school community.

Below is an excerpt directly from the School Attendance Policy from NSW Department of Education.

What are the responsibilities of Parents?

Parents must ensure:

- 1.1. Their children of compulsory school age are enrolled in a government or registered non-government school or, they are registered with the Board of Studies, Teaching and Educational Standards (BOSTES) for Home Schooling.
- 1.2. Their children who are enrolled at school attend every day the school is open for their instruction.
- 1.3. They provide an explanation for absences by means such as a telephone call, written note, text message or email to the school within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence.
- 1.4. They work in partnership with the school to plan and implement strategies to support regular attendance at school, including communicating with the school if they are aware of issues impacting on their child's attendance or engagement with school

Holidays are not considered as exemptions to student absences. Vacations are encouraged to be taken during the school vacation period. Applications must be made to the school principal so that consideration can be made to issue parents and caregivers with a certificate of extended leave. Please contact the school if you require the application form for a certificate of leave. It is the law that our staff must comply with the administration of the school attendance policy so you will notice that phone calls will be made if students are not at school over the course of a couple of days with no reasonable explanation. If you should have any questions regarding school attendance please do not hesitate to contact our school to speak with me.

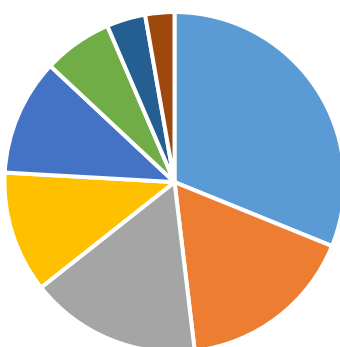

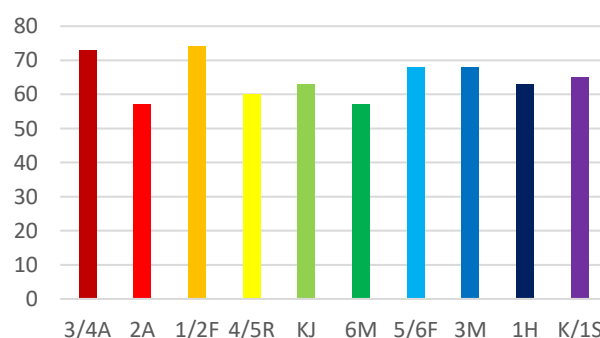

At Leura PS we pride ourselves in looking after our school environment. You will never find any litter in our playground as we don't want rubbish endangering our three endangered species and our school totems. These are:

The Giant Burrowing Frog,
The Giant Dragonfly, and
The Blue Mountains Water Skink.



Each class recycles their paper waste and all fruit scraps are placed in the compost bins. Our Environment Club empty them into the compost bins in our kitchen garden twice a week. They look after the watering of the vegetables and fruit plants, which can be used as ingredients by our 'healthy food' canteen.



The students learn all about protecting our environment in class and are involved in National Tree Day, World Environment Day, Walk to School Day and more.

We also have a Gardening Club, who tend care of our beautiful garden beds, Indigenous gardens which are looked after by our Indigenous
